Roman Forts and Fortresses - Historic England

Roman forts and fortresses (as opposed to camps) were the permanent or semi-permanent bases of Roman troops These installations were a very important feature of the Roman period in Britain, as the British provinces were some of the most heavily militarised in the Roman Empire The word fortress is used to denote the bases of the legions
