Crime and Punishment in Medieval England c1000-1500—Norman Conquest Norman kings believed that any crime was an insult to the king's peace Therefore, the system of wergild ended and was replaced by punishments that were designed to emphasise the power of the king, rather than to give compensation to the victim

London plagues 1348-1665

The term 'Black Death' was first used in the 1800s Medieval people called the disease the 'Great Pestilence' Many people believed the plague spread through bad air so they smoked tobacco to stop any bad air entering their lungs After the Black Death, plague returned to London many times until its last major outbreak in 1665
