Vindolanda is a fort on the Stanegate 'frontier' which preceded Hadrian's Wall It continued to be occupied as part of the Hadrian's Wall frontier system, but the famous writing-tablets belong to the earlier period, from c AD 92 to c 120, ie to the larger fort which underlies the visible stone fort and its vicus
